From Pastor Mark's Desk.....

Happy Easter

He is Risen! He is Risen, Indeed. Alleluia! This will be our chorus for the Easter season as we celebrate the resurrection. After our Lenten journey we are met with great joy and hope on Easter morning! The tomb is empty, he is risen, and all things are made new. This story has been enacted by followers of Christ for



roughly two thousand years and even now I'm not sure we can fully comprehend what has happened. Jesus was killed with all the shame and horror a cross has to offer, sealed in a tomb for three days, and was raised to new life. Just that event in itself would have been amazing. But wait there's more (said with the best TV salesman voice you can muster). This Easter event is not just for Jesus alone but for you too. St. Paul writes, "for if we have been united with him in a death like his, we will certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his." Romans 6:5 In the waters of our baptism we have been united with Christ in a death like his, our old self is put to death. Because we have been united with him in a death like his, we are united with him in his resurrection as well and his new life is ours. On Easter Sunday Jesus did not rise to new life by himself, he took us with him and made that new life ours as well.

The big question for the disciples so long ago, and the question for us, is: "now what?" How will you live in response to this good news? We no longer have the fear of working for or earning our salvation, we have been freed from the dread of death, we have been free to simply love our neighbors as ourselves with no conditions. How will you live in response to this good news? We are not left at the tomb for long. In fact after a brief visit the disciples are back on the road sharing what they've seen. We too are sent back out into the world to declare what we've seen.

The good news that we celebrate this Easter season is good news for us mortal creatures who will die. But it's more than good news for after the end of our earthly existence; it's good news now! We have been given new life in Christ and that starts now and is good forever. If you reduce the good news to only something that happens in the afterlife, you've missed a lot of good news. It's now and it's for you!

So this Easter season live your resurrection life to the fullest. Smile at people, forgive those who sin against you, rejoice in your forgiveness, be gracious and loving, hold open doors, tip well, speak well of one another, say "how are you?" and deeply listen for the answer, carry one another's grieves and burdens, and in all you do share God's amazing love. May God's Easter blessing be upon you, may the Holy Spirit be with you, and may you share that blessing with the world.

• November 30, 1952 The church and parsonage are dedicated. Total cost to construct & equip both buildings is \$43,000.

"It was almost all voluntary labor. Never had any among us ever worked so hard, or known a more joyous experience as we labored together, in a bond of close fellowship" (Viola McCullough).

 October 4, 1953 The organ, pews and carpeting are dedicated. Before the pews were installed, members sat on folding chairs. These chairs were packed back & forth each Sunday between the sanctuary for worship service and the basement for Sunday School. The men and boys who packed the chairs were very relieved to give up this duty when the pews arrived.

"The women of the church cooking for Toastmaster, Weyerhaeuser businessmen and other catered affairs helped the church purchase the first Wurlitzer organ and other needed things" (Rosemary Coverdale).

The Shelter Experience

A brief word of thanks to you as a faith community for opening your hearts and our doors to the homeless, and nearly homeless, of the Snoqualmie Valley. Since the middle of February our fellowship hall has been transformed each evening into a homeless shelter. Individuals and families who need a place to stay have found refuge under our roof. Somewhere around twenty people spent the night and around thirty or forty ate dinner each night of shelter operation. The goal was simple: to give people a place to stay and be served a meal. What we ended up doing was so much more. We helped people see their value, their human dignity, and showed them God's love. The shelter is now closed for the season and closing a shelter is hard. We strive to find permanent solutions to complex issues and that is hard work indeed but we've seen the start. We ask for continued prayers for the homeless in our community and nationwide. If you have a passion to volunteer and stay involved with the "Congregations for Homeless", please contact Pr. Mark and he can connect you to the shelter director.

"This is the first time in a long time, I could sit and eat a hot meal indoors."



Hearing The Power Of God's Good News by The Rev. Wm Chris Boerger, Bishop

Robert Bertram, a seminary professor of mine, once said, "You can only know how bad it is once you know how good it is." By that he meant that we can only really see the true reality of sin and its destructive power after you know the power of forgiveness and God's grace. I find that to be true. People seem to want to live in the depression of sin or in the triumphalism of Easter. Connecting the two is often forgotten.

One of the great gifts we have as Lutheran Christians is that we hold both the Law and the Gospel as honest words of God. To truly deal with the condemning word of the Law I need to hear the power of God's good news in my life. I am not hung up with my sin. I am freed by the power of the gospel to repent and to respond to the consequences of evil that surround me.

Good works do not save us. Good works do follow from our faith. It is not a condition, but a response to the grace of God that does heal the world. That is a tricky part of the Christian life. We will act in the face of evil. That action comes out of the Easter message that Christ is risen and death has been defeated for us. Our action does not conquer death. Christ does that.

Our anxious culture wants a triumphant church that is a respite from the anxiety of the world. It is tempting to say that the church is the place where the problems of the world are simply set aside in the victory of Jesus over the grave. The fact is that Jesus calls us to take up our cross and follow. We will walk with the poor and the ignored. We will act on the grace of God in those places that we really would not want to be.

The Easter message is not about a pastoral picture of peace. It is about God's victory which empowers and calls us to greater clarity about what is going on in the world. Our world can be a beautiful place. It also can be a place of evil and pain. As followers of Jesus, we are called to be in the world as it really is. We do not deny the pain in ourselves or in the creation because we know the good news of Jesus, we can face the news of the world and of our lives and proclaim Christ is Risen. He is risen, indeed. Alleluia!


