Faith, Hope, and Love

And now faith, hope, and love abide, these three; and the greatest of these is love. I Corinthians 13:13

In a recent e-mail exchange with an old friend, I started to refer to his life in Christ as a “faith” journey, but then I stopped myself and wrote, “your faith, hope, and love” journey. Over the years I have found myself wanting to correct people who talk or write about our “faith” journeys, “faith” formation, or, refer to churches as “faith” communities.

I'd better explain myself: I like to think of our life in Christ and our life together as “faith, hope and love,” journeys. Being mindful of this three-fold understanding of life together and life in Christ keeps me focused on love and hope, as well as faith. Over the years I've found myself incorporating faith, hope and love into my prayers and even into the blessing I speak to non-communing children and adults: “May Jesus, the bread of life, nourish you in faith, hope, and love.” When I pray, for myself and for others, I pray that God will grow us in faith, hope, and love.

I suppose my thinking about this has been shaped by the letters of St. Paul, beginning with the passage from 1 Corinthians 13:13, “faith, hope, and love abide, these three; and the greatest of these is love.” I think the opening passages of Paul's letter to the Colossians sums this up beautifully: “In our prayers for you we always thank God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, for we have heard of your faith in Christ Jesus and of the love that you have for all the saints, because of the hope laid up for you in heaven. You have heard of this hope before in the word of truth, the gospel that has come to you.”

Last Sunday as I was sitting in the pew during the worship service, I noticed the “Faith, Hope, and Love,” stained glass window above the altar. What a graphic reminder of this three-fold understanding of our life in Christ. Faith, hope, and love, these three; and the greatest of these is love.

The Transition Team, working in collaboration with Interim Pastor Thomas, is responsible for research and analysis, documentation and study. The Transition team will lead the congregation through:

- A Review of the Congregation's History and Heritage
- A Review of the Congregation's Constitution (with updates if necessary)

- Develop and/or review MSLC's Vision Statement, Mission Statement, and Core Values
- Review Staffing Needs and Resources
- Review of Property and Other Physical Resources
- Review of Congregational Stewardship

Listening to the congregation and to the community at large is at the heart of the work of the Transition Team. An essential task is to discern God's future for MSLC and, as we are able, consider new opportunities for ministry, mission and direction. While the nuts and bolts work will result in the preparation of Sections 1 and 2 of the Ministry Site Profile (MSP) the real work is identifying where we believe God is leading MSLC. When completed, the MSP will be presented to the call committee as they begin to discern the best pastoral candidate to lead Mt Si Lutheran Church into the future. (The Call Committee will be responsible for preparing Sections 3, 4 and 5 of the MSP.) Please pray for the work of the Mt. Si Lutheran Church Transition Team.

An Evening with Supreme Court Justice Mary Yu

"Juvenile Justice: Raising our Children in the Modern Village"

The special evening will begin with a presentation by Justice Yu on Juvenile Justice followed by a dessert reception. All are welcome.

Appointed by Governor Jay Inslee on May 1, 2014, Justice Yu joined the Supreme Court after more than 14 years as an accomplished trial court judge in King County Superior Court. Justice Yu is the first Asian, the first woman of color (Asian and Latina) and the first member of the LGBT community to serve on the Washington Supreme Court.

St. Luke's Lutheran Church is honored to host Justice Yu for a conversation on juvenile justice. One of the most crucial tasks we face as parents and community members is raising healthy kids in a complex and quickly changing world.

As part of this conversation, Justice Yu will share her journey of vocation and then focus on her work relating to juveniles. She will discuss the important role that faith communities can play in the work of justice.

This fall the adult group will read and discuss the book “**Mudhouse Sabbath**” by Lauren Winner. Pastor Larry and Sue Shardelman will be leading these discussions. Grab a cup of coffee and join us in the library for lively conversation & fellowship. We meet at **9:45 am**.

Book Description: *Lauren Winner converted from Orthodox Judaism to Christianity in early adulthood. Soon after her conversion, she noticed that Christianity lacked much discipline or emphasis when it came to performing rituals, so integral to the Jewish faith. "This book is about those things that I miss," she writes. "It is about Sabbaths and burials and prayers, rituals Jews and Christians both observe.... Jews do these things with more attention and wisdom not because they are more righteous nor because God likes them better, but rather because doing, because action, sits at the center of Judaism. Practice is to Judaism what belief is to Christianity. Your faith may come and go but your practice ought not to waiver." She organizes her chapters according to the rituals and values that both religions share--such as prayer, candle lighting and weddings--and discusses how Christians could deepen these rituals by taking a few lessons from the Jews.*

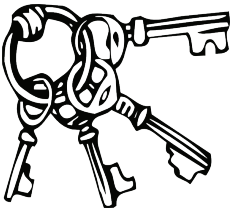

August 17th (Wed): 8:00-9:00am Transport backpacks from MSL to the food bank (4-5 people with vehicles)

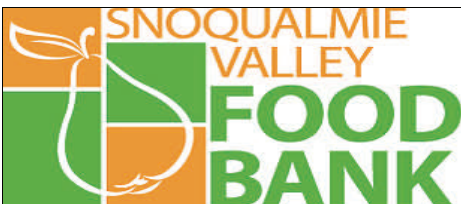

Council Corner!

Mt Si Lutheran has been busy this summer. We started with a “town hall” meeting on June 5th where Pastor Larry walked us through the transition process. Table discussions gave everyone an opportunity to share their points of view regarding the provided talking points. The meeting was followed by a congregational vote to give the council permission to move toward a contract to host the winter shelter next year. The congregation voted in favor for the council to move forward with hosting the winter shelter after January 6, 2017 if an agreement can be reached with Congregations For the Homeless (CFH). The shelter liaison committee prepared an agreement in July and we are waiting to hear back from CFH. If you are interested in learning more about the shelter or would like to be on the liaison committee please contact me or Jack Boller.

On July 17th a church meeting was held to address the four proposals for the future of the Parsonage. Everyone had an opportunity to voice their opinion and ask questions. A congregation meeting to vote on the future of the parsonage is scheduled for July 31st after service. A descriptive copy of the proposals is available in the church office. The council has been busy working with the Stewardship and Finance committee to move our bank accounts and electronic giving from Bank of America to Umpqua Bank.

The Council voted to elect the following people for the transitional team: **Inge Burnside, Beth Luna, Carol Reitz, Jim Flanagan, Dave Spurling and Terry Adams.** Quarterly congregational forums will be scheduled to give updates on the progress of the transitional team. The first forum is tentatively scheduled for September 18th between services. Two services resume on Sept. 18.

I encourage everyone to get involved in our church. We have several opportunities coming up: VBS, Church Family Camping Trip, Back to School Supplies, God’s Work Our Hands.

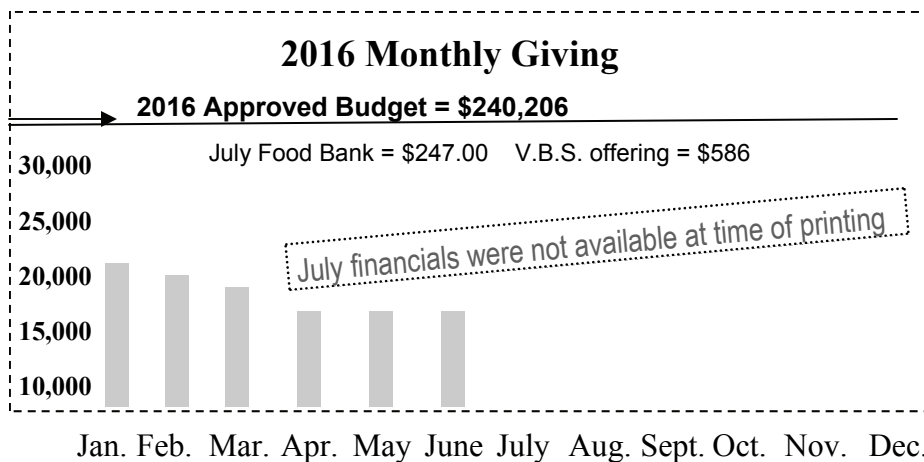

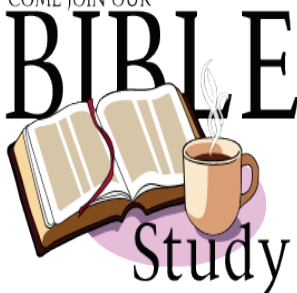

God's Gift of Friendship

His death is still settling in. I lost my best friend - John Mark Ericksen. We met at Pacific Lutheran Theological Seminary. John had just returned from serving with the Peace Corp in Niger, West Africa. He had spent his tour teaching the local people how to build sustainable wells. Clean drinking water was life-giving water to the villages John accompanied.

It was service John loved. He loved the people. He loved their way of life. And he loved his horse that provided him both transportation and thrill.

John grew up in a family filled with pastors. His father, his older brother, and several uncles. He was the youngest of five brothers. My hunch is John was his mother's favorite. We would travel back and forth from PLTS together. John lived in Tacoma. I lived in Kenmore. His mother Evelyn would always say to me as we departed, "Now you take good care of John." It was a charge I took to heart. Friends take care of friends.

John was one of those people everyone liked. He was quiet and yet engaging. He was a great listener and had a very natural way of affirming others. His movements were slow, precise and ended with an exclamation. He even ate his meals this way. I would be finished and John would have barely started. He would carefully cut his food, and top it off with a slight flare of his knife before returning it to its proper place.

In many ways we were polar opposites and yet deeply bonded in our friendship. We could go for months without talking or seeing one another and then immediately take up the friendship where we had left off. Our friendship was seamless. There was never any guilt or shame with John.

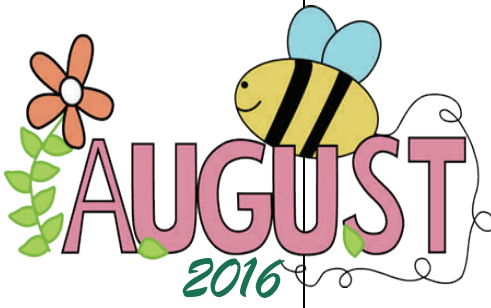
It was a very sad day when I learned that John had been diagnosed with the early onset of dementia. It meant he would have to resign his call as pastor and go on long term disability. The decline would be gradual - but irreversible. Slowly, but surely, I was losing my friend. His ability to track the present was challenged, but his memory of the past was often better than my own. We would go out on the boat together and spend the bulk of the time talking about the good old days and the mischief we committed. We would stay up late and laugh into the night.

When I was elected bishop I wanted John to be a part of the service. I asked him to be the crucifer knowing he would need to be accompanied. Our four daughters flanked him on all sides and escorted him to the altar. It brought them great joy. They too loved John. Seeing John "lift high the cross" was the highlight of the installation service for me.

These last few years the rate of the decline had increased. Marita did everything under her power to protect John's dignity and provide for his care. The day before John died, she made it possible for me to talk to him on the phone. I said Johnny, "We are going to take a boat ride." His response was, "Wonderful!"

John was my wonderful friend. He became a well of living water for me. Even in his death he continues to bring me life. A true gift from God. Now God, you take good care of John Mark as we trust him to your care and the promise of the resurrection.

Flower Chart for the Sanctuary

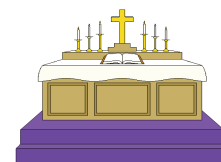

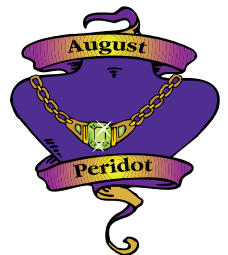

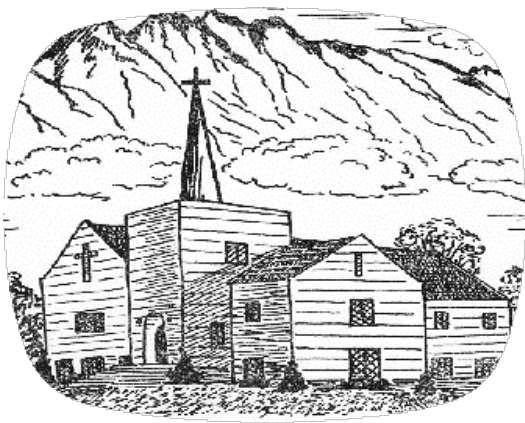
