

From Pastor Mark's Desk.....

PRAYER

The season of Lent is often considered a season of prayer and repentance. They both offer a perspective on this life of faith to which we have been called. Repentance is the turning from the distractions we create for ourselves back to the way God has invited us



to live. Prayer is a cosmic and intimate connection between us as individuals and communities with God. It is an astounding gift. Prayer is often more than the words we say but an orientation of our lives. It is prayer that I would like to focus on for the moment.

To begin my thought on prayer we need to start with the Nicene Creed. When we confess the Nicene Creed there is a comma that is often overlooked. Typically, it is just a pause to catch our breath as we carry on with the creed. But I would like to explore the power of this statement for just a moment.

We believe in God the Father Almighty, maker of that is, seen and unseen.

The comma in question is the final one in the sentence. After we confess that we believe in God who is the Father and is indeed almighty we confess that it is this God that is the maker of all creation. Then there is this amazing comma. It tilts our imaginations from the enormity of the cosmos to those things that are seen and the things which we cannot see.


From all that is—everything we can imagine in the enormity of existence—all the way down to the stuff of our everyday life.

Recently, the list of what we can see got a little longer. Scientists discovered the gravitational waves that Einstein predicted. And how did they do that you might wonder? They listened. That's right, scientists built a laser listening device that was able to hear the waves of gravity that stretched and squeezed the distance traveled by the light.

And here is where prayer comes in. We do not need a laser listening device to tune in to the divine rhythm of the creator. The orientation of prayer is the practice of listening to the waves of God that crash about in creation.

This season of Lent, catch a wave, listen deeply to what God is up to in you and in the world. Let us be people of prayer—highly tuned God detectors—ready to listen, respond, and act with grace in the world.

Building and Grounds has completed the project for surveying the church property. Realigning the property boundaries allows the church more options when considering what to do with the parsonage as well as long term plans for the church.

The cost for the rekeying of the church buildings has been recalculated based on the number of locks needed. Stewardship and Finance will be working with Building and Grounds to hold an upcoming fund drive for the remaining amount needed. A private donor is matching the contributions. Once funding is secured, we will proceed with the re-keying project.

Pastor and the executive team are working with a church financial expert on simplifying our accounting system to make it more efficient. Once the system is in place we can fill the treasurer position.



Is Serving as Worship Assistant Really a Ministry? Absolutely!

USHERING

Ushering is a public ministry of hospitality and evangelism. In a real and vital way, ushers are the "welcoming committee" here at Mt. Si Lutheran Church. Ushers model the congregation's intention to be a welcoming and hospitable community where everyone may feel comfortable as they worship. Knowledge and understanding of the meaning of worship enables ushers to realize that ushering is indeed a vital and holy ministry.

COMMUNION HELPER

The Communion Helper also serves a vital and holy ministry. They assist the Pastor with distributing the "Bread" and "Wine" to those wishing to receive Holy Communion.

ACOLYTE

The word Acolyte is an ancient Greek word meaning helper or follower. Acolytes help shape the worship experience by lighting and extinguishing (putting out) the Altar candles. Since ancient times, light and fire have reminded God's people that God is here among us. When you bring the light into God's house, you are reminding worshippers that God is present as we worship. When you exit with the lit candlelight, you remind people that Jesus Christ is the light of the world and we are to let His light shine through us as we go out into our community. Your active, reverent participation in the Liturgy is a demonstration of your Christian witness and service to our Lord.

LECTOR

For the earliest times of the church, the reading of Scripture has been an essential part of Christian worship. Scripture remains a central authority for our Christian lives. The lector is the minister who brings the Word of God to life for all to hear. This calling requires preparation so that the readings can become a vehicle for sharing the Word with God's people.

Each of these Worship Assistant positions are vital to each Sunday service. It is becoming more and more challenging to coordinate the list of volunteers for this ministry due to not knowing which service time is preferred, or dates that are more desirable than others due to holidays and vacations. For this reason, we would like to ask that anyone who is interested in serving as Worship Assistant, please complete a Worship Assistant form provided in the fellowship hall, narthex, or contact the office. This will surely help when trying to provide this information for our bulletin and newsletter. Please prayerfully consider volunteering for this vital ministry. Serving as worship assistant is easy to perform and even younger teens and pre-teens can help out! What a great way to give of yourselves and serve the Lord!

Has the Church Run Out of Wine?

In January I had the joy of presiding at the installation of Pr. Tim Feiertag at Trinity Lutheran Church in Everett, WA. The Biblical Story for the day was the Wedding at Cana in Galilee. It was the assigned text and so fitting because in the Book of John the Wedding at Cana was Jesus' Installation service.

I began by telling the story of Johnny Carson interviewing a little boy who had just heard the Cana Story in Sunday school. When Johnny asked him what he learned from the

story the little boy said, "If you are going to have a wedding you better invite Jesus!"

You may know the story. It was the third day of the celebration when the news reached Jesus that the party had run out of wine. Jewish weddings were known to go on for days. I can only imagine the number of guests who would have decided to call it quits and head home. I am confident others would have let their disappointment be made known. It must have been crushing for the bride and groom.

Jesus' mother knows that the hour has come for her son to do what he was sent into the world to do – to restore the world to the fullness of life. When she lets Jesus know, "They have no wine," Jesus tells the servants to take the six jars which held between 20-30 gallons of water for the Jewish purification rites and to fill them. Following the admonition of Jesus' mother, "Do whatever he tells you to do." They fill the jars to the brim. Jesus then instructs them to draw some out and bring it to the master of the banquet who discovers upon tasting it that it is the finest of wine.

This takes the master by total surprise because nobody brings out the best wine near the end of the party. You always serve the best wine first.

Not Jesus.

No, Jesus is at his best when we are desperate. When we finally run out. When we are empty. When our party is all but over Jesus appears. When Jesus comes he not only provides, he provides abundantly – to the brim.

Has it ever dawned on you that the best that life has to offer is still to come?

Risking this possibility - how might it change the way you enter the future?

Imagine how this could change the way we live life in our congregations and ministry sites.

The best is yet to come if we are willing to invite Jesus to the party!


