
Upcoming Events in February



Pastor's Note

Grace and peace to you from God our Father and our Lord and Savior Jesus the Christ!

This month I have the joy of going with several families from Mt Si to serve in Trinidad and Tobago. I thank the congregation for supporting me in this effort and for supporting the whole team who are going to represent each of you! As we are in Trinidad building a home I would ask for your prayers each day. In those prayers I would ask that you include

- 1. a prayer for health of all our team members
- 2. A prayer for opportunities to share the Gospel and our love for Jesus
- 3. A prayer for the family we are building a home for-that this home will offer stability and a bright future and pull them out of a cycle of poverty.
- 4. A prayer for the people of Trinidad and Tobago—that they may experience moments of love and joy in their lives just as we pray that for ourselves and those we hold dear.

Thank you in advance for your prayers. I know it has been a strength to me on previous mission trips to know that I do not go alone, but with a whole community of faith supporting me and the work of those sent to serve.

This year my prayer for us at Mt Si Lutheran Church is that we would be emboldened by the Spirit to be invitational: For example: inviting those we know or meet to worship or Bible Study or a Lent Soup Supper or

....AND that we would be purposeful in our engagement of new visitors and members. For example: inviting them to sit with you at coffee hour, sharing our contact info and inviting interaction during the week, asking for a visitors contact info so you can reach out during the week to engage, being open to the new ideas our new members bring and not immediately assume that "they way we've always done things" is the only way or even the best way. On many levels I know that many here already strive to do all the things I've listed. My challenge is to the whole congregation to take a leap of faith and see where the Spirit might lead us as we seek to share the Gospel of Jesus Christ with everyone we

We exist as a church to share the good news far and wide. In a way, we exist for those who are not yet here. We certainly don't neglect the community of members already here, but we also don't assume that those who currently gather here are the only ones who ought to be here. I don't think that comes as a surprise to any of us. Brothers and Sisters in Christ, there is an abundance around us here in the Sno Valley. God is about death and resurrection and abundance! Let's build on the faithful witness of all the generations who have gone before us! There is a future here for Go's people! Amen! - Pastor Krista

UPCOMING COUNCIL EFFORTS TO LOOK OUT FOR

- 1. Bringing Baby Grand Piano into the worship space. We are making progress on this! The front pew by the pulpit has been removed to make room for the new piano. Work to find out cost of moving is the next step. .
- 2. Watching our budget. The council is keeping a close eye on spending. All committees will be receiving monthly print-outs with their spending so everyone knows what is going on.
- 3. Council Priorities for 2020 have been set. The council is focusing on three goals for 2020. Goal 1 is the help each ministry of Mt Si to shape their events and plans around our Mission Statement and help ministry teams to articulate the mission in all we do. Goal 2 is to be active in considering new funding streams and working to determine where budgets may need to be adjusted to meet our current giving. Goal 3 Develop clear evangelism and outreach plan for 2020!

Guest Pastors For February 16th and 23rd

Feb. 16th Pastor David Hahn will preach and preside at worship. During our Adult Education time he will teach about the following initiation in our Synod.

There is a new initiative in our Synod to help inform and guide the development of a new lay school of ministry in our synod: Living into Vocational Engagement (LiVE!)

LiVE! will be a way to accompany lay leaders in our synod who wish to discover, deepen, and participate more fully in God's call in their lives. The Rev. David Hahn, PhD will be taking the lead on this initiative. Most recently Rev. Hahn has been serving as the leader of the Synod's Living Local initiative, which encourages and teaches congregations how to connect more deeply with the community around them.



Feb. 23rd Pastor Chris Ode will preach and preside at worship. During our Adult Education time he will teach about a unique prison ministry in our Synod.

Established in 2006, Living Stones Prison Congregation is a ministry of the ELCA operating "behind the walls" of the Washington Corrections Center (Shelton). Pastor Chris Ode spends his time ministering directly to the members of the congregation, developing reentry resources and opportunities, and sharing stories from "the inside" with

outside congregations and community groups. He lives happily with the funniest woman on earth, two inquisitive young children, and a pair of loyal - but dense - Labrador retrievers. 
Shrove Tuesday

- What is happening in your church's neighborhood? Where do you see possibilities for partnership or collaboration?
- What is our unique ELCA identity and witness?
- Are there avenues to talk with and listen to those outside the walls of the church?
- How can we equip disciples and our own community of faith?
- How can we foster a spirit of connection across the synod?
- What are the resources needed to develop new leaders?
- How can we partner with young adults, listening and collaborating?
- Where are the places we can be more ecofriendly in our church buildings?
- Who are those marginalized?
- Who are those discriminated against?

Of course, there are other areas to consider for ministry through these Grace Grants. These are just a few ideas that might help.

As you prepare, here are some important dates:

- February 1 Grant Application Period open, find form on synod website.
- May 1 Applications due. No late applications will be accepted.
- May Grant committee review will take place.
- June 5 Final approval of Grants by Synod Council.
- June 6 Notification of grants awarded at Synod Assembly.
- July 1 Grants to be funded

Grants need to be used between July 1, 2020 & April 1, 2021. Grants are potentially renewable.

I hope you find this opportunity as exciting as the Northwest Washington Synod Council. We are excited to continue vitalizing our congregations and ministry sites into the future – as we trust God is walking with us, leading us and guiding us.
